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# **RFP: Expedited Engagement Program**

### **OVERVIEW**

On March 30<sup>th</sup>, the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for one contractor to operate an Expedited Engagement Program in the Bronx and/or Brooklyn. This program will proactively reach out to individuals affected by racial inequity who may require mental health resources and other supports. A Family Connection Specialist employed by the program will link young adults and their families to an array of mental health and/or community-based services and social supports.

OMH will provide a total of \$600,000 during the five-year program period to one awarded contractor for the operation of the program.

The RFP is available here. Applications are due on June 7<sup>th</sup>.

#### FUNDING

The awarded contractor will receive \$120,000 in annual funding. Administrative costs may not exceed 15 percent of the budget.

Contracts will last for five years beginning on October 1st.

# ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Eligible applicants are not-for-profit 501(c)(3) agencies with experience providing mental health services to individuals with serious mental illness.

#### **PROGRAM SERVICES**

The awarded contractor must develop and maintain an expedited engagement and outreach program that will serve individuals in the Bronx and/or Brooklyn. The program must:

- Employ at least one full-time Family Connection Specialist who will provide telephonic and inperson assistance, psychoeducation, and connections to health/behavioral care and other community-based services and supports;
- Provide language access to racial/ethnic minorities with limited English proficiency;
- Provide services that are trauma-informed and culturally competent;
- Establish a platform for receiving community-based referrals and provide outreach to those referrals within two business days by trained volunteers or staff; and
- Market the program through public education, outreach efforts, and other promotional events.

# TARGET POPULATION

To receive services through this program, individuals must:

- Be New York City residents;
- Be aged 18-25 years; and

• Have experienced (or be a family member of someone who has experienced) racism or racial inequity in the community.

Since the program is not Medicaid-funded, citizenship is not required in order to receive services.

# APPLICATION

Proposals will be scored based on the following criteria:

- Population (10 points)
- Description of Program (30 points)
- Implementation (15 points)
- Reporting and Quality Improvement (15 points)
- Financial Assessment (20 points)
- Equity Language (10 points)

Proposals must receive a minimum score of 70 to be considered for funding. In the event of a tie, the applicant with the highest score on the "Description of Program" section will receive the higher ranking.

# Timeline

Proposals must be submitted by June 7<sup>th</sup>. Interested parties are <u>required</u> to submit a non-binding Letter of Intent to <u>carol.swiderski@omh.ny.gov</u> with the subject line "Expedited Engagement RFP" by May 25<sup>th</sup>. Awards are expected to be announced on July 1<sup>st</sup>.
